The NVBA's attempt to revive its I/N game by offering free bridge to 199ers in June was a resounding success. After starting with 8 tables the first week, it grew to 12 1/2 by the last week. That coupled with 25 Swiss teams for the STAC blew the walls out on June 27th, with the overflow playing in an adjacent room. Clearly, there are 199ers out there. What remains to be seen is how many will continue to play. You have indicated that you want your own game, and we'll be happy to run one for you.

July was a quiet month for the Unit game. With the 4th falling on the first Thursday and the Nationals spanning two others only one game was held. We'll get back into the regular swing of things in August and September with the exception of August 22, when we will close in deference to the Hunt Valley Regional. Upcoming highlights

include a membership game on September 5 and another STAC Swiss on September 12.

We were delighted to see so many of you show up in the winner's circle at the Nationals. You'll find many of those winners listed in the Jack of Hearts. (See pages 12-14 for a complete list of NVBAers who finished first or second in events at the NABC.)

Even if you only put in an appearance, you must have been impressed with the excitement of tournament bridge at the highest level. We hope you'll carry that excitement back to the Unit game.

We were saddened to learn of the death of Frank Mackey, longtime area club director. I last worked with Frank in June, when he ran the 199er game at the Unit. His passing leaves a great void in the bridge community.

The Jack of Hearts

Many considered the last NABC here in 1993, the mother of all Nationals because of the unparalleled hospitality, tours, and entertainment. Well, if you liked that one, you had to like the 2002 edition because Margot Hennings and her staff put on the same wonderful tournament. The Capitol Steps (assisted by our leading thespian, Jeff Roman) performed as they did in 1993, only then they were roasting Bush, the elder. The Clinton material would come later when they discovered what a “Gorny Huy” he was. Ah, yes, 1993! Michael Jordan was a Bull, Cal Ripken was at short, and no one had heard of Monica Lewinsky, Mohammed Atta, or hanging chads, and “evildoers” existed only in the comics, not in boardrooms throughout America. Indeed, it was a kinder, gentler time. You see, everything is relative.

One difference from 1993, was that not as many people partook of the pleasures we offered. The table count of 14,650 was down by more than 3000 and everybody had a theory. Some locals said they wouldn’t come because it was too expensive, but if you plow through the list of winners in the next paragraph, you will wonder exactly which locals stayed away. Some said folks were afraid to come to Washington. That might account for a few, but bridge players are a brave lot. us have taken a hit, but in better times did we sell a few hundred shares of Oracle to afford the Nationals? Finally, folks were going to the World Championships in Montreal in August instead, but don’t the players who go to the Worlds, go to both? Besides, if you had to choose, why would you go to Canada and risk being drafted? It was probably a combination of reasons, but 14,650 was still the fourth largest NABC since 1993.

Many NVBAers not only attended, but managed to play some fine bridge, not the least of which were our newest National Champions, Alan Schwartz and Ai-Tai Lo, who won the IMP Pairs. We have to wonder if Alan knew that was coming since he predicts for a living. Others with National overalls were Helene Bauman and Tom Cogan who were 4th in the Mixed Teams, Sven Pride 7th in the Fast Pairs, Bobby Gookin (LM Pairs), Cecily Kohler (IMP Pairs), Yi Zhong (IMP and Fast Pairs), and Chuck Yaple and Ken Davis (Fast Pairs). Carolyn Gibson reached the round of eight in the 0-5000 mini-Spangold, while David Milton and Stan Schenker, and Sumner Steinfeldt went out a round earlier. Leo and Frank Cardillo, Bob Zier, and Jim Witting were 3/4 in the 0-1500 mini-Spin with Joe Ogulin in the other semifinal while Rachel Bethe was 5/8. The Red Ribbon Pairs overalls were teeming with Northern Virginians including John Montgomery, Dan Kasture and Scott Johnson, David Jackson and Marty Zupan, Ralph Angermeier and Bert Hackney, and

Bernie Oetjen and Madan Nanda. Regional wins went to Don Geerhart and Steve Lurie, Robert and Linda Padgett, Bruce Bucklinger, Steve Rothman, Jay Kelkar and Mahadeo Patwardhan, Richard Cassell, Mitch Karlick, Steve Goldstein, Gary Weinstein, Leo and Frank Cardillo, Bob Zier, Jim Witting, Yi Zhong, David Kaplan, John Hornbeck, David Rodney, Don Hennings, Sam Gumbert, Bill Brown, Nan Logwood and Ed Gofreed, Paul Bubendey, Pat

Beebe, Mary Murphy, Al Duncker and Hal Holtzclaw, Daniel Morgan, Ibrahim Mady, Tom Lavender, Jake Parrott, and Mark Chen. Finally, some new LMs were crowned including John Ferman, Fran McNaught, and Lynette Vanderschaaf. Congratulations to all!

Directions: From Rte. 495 (the Beltway) or points West of the Beltway, take Rte. 68 East to the Washington Boulevard/Lee Highway exit. At the light at the end of the exit ramp, turn left onto Lee Highway. Go approximately 1.5 miles and turn left onto Harrison Street. Go 5 miles and turn right onto Little Falls Road. The KOCH is on your left 2 of a mile down Little Falls. From D.C. or Arlington, take Rte. 68 West to the Sycamore Street exit. At the end of the exit ramp, turn right onto Sycamore. At the second light, turn right onto Lee Highway and go a little over 1 mile and turn left onto Harrison Street. Follow the above directions from that point. Or from D.C., go straight across Chain Bridge and then keep left to stay on Glebe Road. From the light at the end of Chain Bridge, proceed 1.8 miles and turn right onto Little Falls Road (the second right past the light at Williamsburg Lane). Cross Old Dominion (.3 miles) at the stop sign and proceed on Little Falls another .3 miles to the KOCH on your right. Also from Arlington or Falls Church, simply take Lee Highway to Harrison. From McLean, use Rte. 66 East or you can also take Rte. 123 to Old Dominion and stay on Old Dominion, turning right onto Little Falls just after you pass Williamsburg. From all directions, turn up the drive and circle past the stone lodge. Follow signs for visitor parking. The tournament will be held in the brick building marked "KOCH 2473" down the hill to your right.
