She passed away earlier this year after a long illness. It was lovely; many stories were shared regarding Janet's kindness, expert play and sense of humor. On September 11, 2019 there was a gathering in memory of Leo Cardillo; many tales of his life were presented by his friends and family. Frank, his son, sang a song of his own composition about his father. It was most excellent and very moving. We lost a number of other regu-

lars at the bridge table, who we still miss, including Justice Stevens, Larry Clandorf, Mary Cacciatore, Mildred Hartshorn, and Salam Saidi.

The Grand National Teams (GNT) qualifying period has started in earnest. If you want to qualify, you can go to the District Six website (districtsixbridge.org) to find a list of clubs running qualifiers as well as the dates of the qualifiers at the NVBA and WBL Unit games (note, usually the GNT Swiss team games alternate between WBL and NVBA, so you can actually play twice as many if you aren't afraid to travel a little bit). These games offer the opportunity for your team to qualify or practice for the competition. You do not have to play in the finals with players who qualified with you at the clubs; you can form your team from any group of players who qualified.

with it, they get a free play too! Many hands make light work. Won't you approach Sheila this Thursday and tell her a Thursday in the future when YOU will do the hospitality? We would all appreciate your efforts!

Lessons are presented prior to the unit game beginning at 6:10. Many people have presented lessons for Intermediate/Newcomer education. If you have a topic you would like to use to educate other bridge players, please email or speak to me, Marty Bley. You receive a free play for your effort. Ron Kral can post your presentation on the website so that players can access your information and lessons. There are white boards and markers for your use in the bridge closet.

Bridge in the future in NVBA land: Last July, 15 people took the Director's course before the July Regional. Of those 15 only 5, that is FIVE, were local. Of those 5, only THREE were NEW to directing. Of those three, I think only ONE has an interest in actually becoming a director of a game. Think about where you play bridge, think about the age of the director at your club... Do you see yourself playing bridge in 3 years? 5 Years? 7 Years? 10 Years? Think about the director at your club again. Will THEY still be the director? If you are at all interested in having bridge in NVBA land in the future, you just MIGHT consider taking a director's course in the not too distant future. They are offered prior to ALL NABCs, and just before most Regionals. I am thinking about doing another one next year prior to Reston and would definitely do it if I had enough people interested. So, If you are interested talk to me about it! The future of bridge at your favorite bridge club might just depend on it.

In May of 2020 there will be five positions open on the NVBA Board. Why don't you look to see if you might be interested in doing a job on the Board? It is possible the players in those positions might want to continue, but it is also possible that they won't. I would be glad to hear from you if you are interested in serving a two-year term on the Board.

Come Out and Play in the "Eight is Enough" Leo Cardillo Team Game at Beth El on October 10

Thursday, October 10, 2019, is the Second Annual Leo Cardillo "Eight is Enough" game. The format is Swiss teams, with each four–person team having no more than 8 points according to these criteria:

Player with 2500 or more Masterpoints:	3 points
Player with 500-2499.99 Masterpoints:	2 points
Player with 0-499.99 Masterpoints:	1 point
(Masterpoint total as of ACBL's monthly update on S	eptember 6, 2019)

The game will be stratified: A = 8-point teams; B = 7- or 6- point teams; C = 5- or 4- point teams.

ENTRY FEE: \$5 per player. **The \$2 Beth El Security Fee will be waived.** Any ACBL member with 0-5 Masterpoints plays free at all NVBA events, including this one.

You can <u>SIGN UP</u> at the NVBA website. If you sign up before October 7 as an individual or pair, we will form a team for you. If you have formed your own team you need not sign up, but it is helpful to the organizers to know who is coming to the game, so we don't contact those people to play with other teams. If you sign up as a **pair**, we will find teammates for you; you will **not** be informed who your teammates are in advance, but you **will** be told you have been matched up. If you sign up as a **single** player. A partner and team will be found for you, and you **will** be told who your partner is prior to the event so you can discuss a convention card.

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Jack of Hearts

What happens in Vegas stays in Vegas, right? I guess the implication is that you can have your own private tailhook party or lose some of the kids' college fund and no one will be the wiser. Take inference at your own risk. Read on for the real meaning.

Back in the day, Las Vegas was all about gambling. At the end of WWII, Bugsy Siegel, who had made a lot of money on the business end of a gun, figured out a new way to separate folks from their hard-earned USDs: legalized gambling. He opened a casino in Las Vegas, presumably because he heard a voice say, "If you build it, they will come." They didn't, but once he sweetened the deal, folks started coming and they haven't stopped.

Of course, Bugsy ended up on the wrong end of a gun and didn't get to enjoy the fruits of his idea. So, what changed? First, they added top-quality entertainment. Second, they made it easy. Hotels were cheap. Food was dirt cheap. Parking was free. Now, getting there was a problem. Vegas was about five hours from LA, and the ten hours you spent driving were ten hours you weren't gambling. No problem. When I lived there, I remember advertisements for \$42 round trip airfares. So, go, have fun, but bring money. Lots of money.

For all you spend, you should win lots of masterpoints. Sadly, NVBAers failed to get their share. Our only top ten finishers were Li Yiting who was 6th in the Mixed BAM and Ken Hopke, 7th in the 0-2500 LM Pairs. Others who scratched were Alan Schwartz (LM Pairs and Open Swiss), Hal Hindman (10K Pairs), Helene Bauman with Jim Wakefield, and Ron Kral (Wernher Open Pairs), Monique Smith (Mixed BAM), and Ai-Tai Lo (Open Swiss). An interesting sidelight in the Wernher was three NVBAers playing with their sons (Schwartz, Rodney, and Kuschner). All qualified for the second day, none made the overalls. It wasn't until the flight home that I realized how I could have had a better tournament. I should have simply asked myself, "What would Bugsy do?"

Tribute to John Paul Stevens, Bridge Player

July 16, 2019 was a sad day for America and an especially sad day for Northern Virginia bridge players. That day marked the passing of John Stevens, the third longest serving justice on the Supreme Court and an impassioned bridge player when time permitted. You might think a Supreme Court justice would expect to be addressed as Your Honor or Justice Stevens. You would be wrong. He always wanted to be known and addressed simply as John.

John was born to wealth but fought tirelessly on behalf of the common man. His father owned, among other things, the Stevens Hotel in Chicago, which ultimately became the Chicago Hilton, home to several ACBL national tournaments. John was an avid Cubs fan. He attended the World Series game between the Cubs and Yankees in 1932, where Babe Ruth called his shot. Thankfully, John, who was 99 at his death, lived long enough to see the Cubs win the Series in 2016.

John was a familiar figure at local bridge clubs, especially in the summers when the court was not in session but, come October, we knew we wouldn't see him for a while. He played mostly with his wife, Maryan, until her death in 2015. He played some with his good friend, former World Bridge Federation and National Tournament Director, Bill Schoder and with Grand Life Master and author of bridge books Mike Cappelletti Sr. I first played against John

When I returned to the table, I found John on his hands and knees wiping up a spill. When he looked up, I said, "John, I have good news and bad news. The good news is that I'm ruling in your favor. The bad news is that it's going to cost you."

"Oh," he said, "what's it going to cost me?"

I replied, "I want a picture of Justice Scalia doing what you're doing."

John was a humble man, but a brief moment of ego did not go unpunished. A few years ago in Florida, he played with Bill Schoder. At the end of the game, a player approached, cell phone in hand and asked if he could take a picture. "Of course," said John.

"Who the hell are you?" asked the photographer. "I meant him," gesturing toward Bill.

John was actually a decent player. He amassed just under 1,200 points, mostly because of the limited time he had to devote to bridge. Not that he cared about points. He played only with people he enjoyed. If you were one of those and John comes to you in a dream and tells you there's bridge in heaven, wake up before he tells you you're his partner next week.
